fter receiving training in courses in our office and in 60 classroom visits a year, thousands of teachers continue to use our approach, to the benefit of thousands more

children each year. No other institution in the United States comes in 60 times a year, planning with the teachers, modeling and demonstrating lessons and encouraging the teachers in a personal and friendly way.

THIS SCHOOL YEAR WAS A BANNER YEAR FOR US!

- Over 2,000 NYC students are benefiting from Reading Reform-trained teachers
- 78 teachers received Reading Reform training in 16 NYC schools in four boroughs; six Mt. Vernon schools and, in collaboration with Manhattanville College, one Port Chester school
- 300 teachers took
 Reading Reform courses
- The work goes on with the same enthusiasm as more new schools seek us every year

THE COST:

It costs RRF \$12,500 for a consultant to work with one teacher in the classroom for an entire school year. This fee includes books and materials for implementing the lessons with the children. We charge a school \$2,500 per classroom, and raise the remaining \$10,000 from generous contributions from individuals, corporations, foundations, as well as public sources.

SINCE READING REFORM'S FOUNDING 30 YEARS AGO:

- Almost 30,000 students have been taught, using RRF methodology
- More than 20,000 teachers attended Reading Reform Foundation's conferences in past years and have taken graduate-level courses
- Almost 1,200 teachers have been part of the in-school teacher-training program
